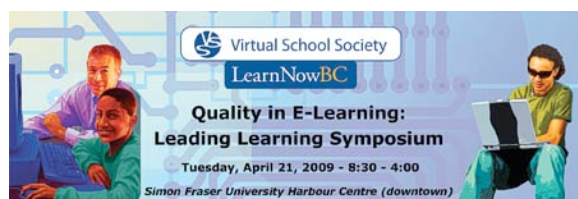
## BC Provincial Exam Prep Packages

Originally called the *Teachers' Centre*, we feel that this name more accurately reflects its function. Teachers were excited about this new service when they learned that it gathers your data by course, or by student, in one central location.

The *Report Centre* will include:

- Report Card function - all the students' grades are in one location
- 1701 and Tracking Data - valuable for audits
- Active and Inactive student reports
- Format reports as spreadsheets, PDF or text files.
